The need for immigration legal services continues to grow and, as always, our staff at American Gateways continues to respond. This past month saw the reinstatement of the Migrant Protection Protocol, or "Remain in Mexico" policy which forced asylum seekers to remain in horrendous and unsafe conditions along the southern US border when seeking asylum.

We continue to see more Afghan refugees arriving to rejoin their families in central Texas and, along with our partners, are providing legal information, representation, and advocacy. Keep an eye out for upcoming pro bono volunteer opportunities in the new year to serve this growing population.

One of our most valuable resources at American Gateways is our staff. Just last month I celebrated my 19 year work anniversary with American Gateways. I feel so privileged and thankful to work with such dedicated colleagues.

54 Helped at Naturalization Clinic

Our San Antonio office hosted its second in-person naturalization clinic this year on Saturday, November 13th. We received over 400 calls from individuals seeking our services before the clinic. With the help of pro bono attorneys and other volunteers, we were able to safely help 54 long-term residents apply for their citizenship, bringing them one step closer to attaining the right to vote!
